Arizonans must be able to exercise their freedom to vote in a safe, accessible manner.

Early voting increases turnout for communities that have access to a variety of effective voting methods like mail delivery, drop box locations, and/or in-person early voting options. Early voting is safe and secure.¹ Providing *reasonable* methods to return a ballot so it arrives on time to be counted is critical to the health of our elections.

- 1. Early Voting is Arizona's most popular voting method and it must be preserved in its various forms.**
- 2. Mail-in voting has a proud history in Arizona for its security and reliability.**
- 3. Ballot drop boxes are a reasonable, reliable, and cost-effective method of voting that allows *all* voters to securely exercise their freedom to vote without intimidation.**
- 4. Emergency Voting is a reasonable method for voting when life happens that avoids disenfranchising voters when counties can plan for it.**
- 5. Vote Centers allow any voter in the county to cast a ballot rather than rejecting out-of-precinct voters.**
- 6. Reliable and tested tabulation equipment is an essential element to count ballots.**
- 7. Timely certification of elections is a priority for all Arizonans.**
